Chinese Bridge Competition

Earlier this year one of our students won the Chinese Bridge Competition in Wellington, earning the incredible opportunity to represent New Zealand at the International Chinese Bridge Competition in China. The trip, fully funded for her and a caregiver, celebrated her dedication, talent, and passion for learning Mandarin. Here is her story of learning at TIS.

My Experience of Learning Chinese Language and Culture at TIS.

When I first joined TIS, Mandarin was just something I wanted to try. I never expected it to become such a defining part of my school life. Two years later, I can honestly say learning Mandarin and being part of the Chinese programme has changed me in ways I never imagined.

The Chinese programme at TIS is more than just language lessons, it's immersive and full of opportunities. We didn't just learn to speak; we learned to understand the culture, values, and stories behind the language, which made it all more meaningful.

A highlight was representing New Zealand at the International Chinese Bridge Competition in China. Standing on stage speaking Mandarin to an international audience was unforgettable. I wasn't just performing, I was realising how far I'd come.

This journey has made me more confident, open-minded, and determined. Mandarin has shaped how I see the world and myself. I'm so grateful to my tutors, teachers, and TIS for their support and for opening doors to new experiences.

Looking ahead, I know Mandarin will continue to be a bridge to future opportunities in travel, study, and global connections. It's not just a language, it's a passport to new possibilities. I encourage anyone to give it a go, you never know where it might take you.
