As the school year draws to a close, we continue to see Tauranga Intermediate School students excelling in many different areas. It was a pleasure to be part of our Sports Prizegiving last night. Education Review Office- ERO

During Week 7 we welcomed the ERO evaluation team to Tauranga Intermediate. Prior to the ERO team arriving, they had read and unpacked a lot of school improvement documentation and data, along with our school's Board Assurance Statements. Whilst at TIS, the ERO team met with the Senior Leadership Team, various staff groups, whānau and students. They also observed a cross section of our teaching team in action.

We will receive our formal ERO Report early next year, however we were provided with the following feedback and assessments which we are delighted with. Here are our draft feedback statements:

Areas of strength

- Students benefit from a broad, localised curriculum and strong pastoral care systems that help them feel valued and supported, fostering resilience and self-management.
- Students have access to diverse learning and co-curricular opportunities that build and extend their interests and talents, enrich their learning experiences, and foster personal growth and confidence.
- Leadership has a clear, values-driven strategic plan and a distributed leadership model that supports accountability and continuous improvement through robust and consistent use of, school-wide best-practice frameworks.
- Literacy and mathematics learning are supported by clear learning intentions, explicit teaching, and assessment for learning strategies. High student engagement reflects growing confidence and participation in these areas.
- Learning is well-planned and culturally connected to local and multicultural contexts, with strong progression and high expectations across literacy, mathematics, and inquiry.
- Staff capability is strengthened through targeted professional learning, coaching, and collaborative planning, building a culture of shared responsibility for improvement.
- Leaders and teachers use reflective processes to align actions with goals and strengthen data use and success measures to drive next steps.

Key priorities

- Increase regular rates of attendance for all learners.
- Improve equitable outcomes for all learners by sustaining rates of acceleration with a focus on curriculum level attainment.
