

Kia ora parents, whānau and caregivers, Term 1, Week 8

It has been great to see such a wide range of learning experiences taking place across our school over the last few weeks. Thank you to those whānau who were able to join us for Ra Whānaungatanga, It was a great success.

Camps:

We are delighted we have kick started our school camps out at Ngamuwahine Lodge. The reports from staff and students have been extremely positive, full of fun, learning, confidence building and adventure.

Last week our Matai students also attended their annual 3 day camps to Mt Maunganui Campground (Year 7) and to Ngāhina Marae, Ruatoki (Year 8). Both groups represented our school superbly. This was reinforced by the email below we received from some members of the public, who were camping at Mt Maunganui. Well done Matai Year 7s!

"Dear Sir,

We are currently staying at the Mount beach camp. Yesterday we were invaded by dozens of children and their caregivers, who proceeded to pitch a dozen or more tents about ten metres from our bus. They are now near the end of their second day and we have had plenty of time to observe them.

HERO:

Our student and teacher HERO posts are starting to roll out. These will be visible on your child's HERO feed. You can interact with these posts by 'liking' them (similar to what is available on social media platforms with an emoji) or by adding a comment. These responses are only visible to you and the classroom teacher/s.

On Tuesday next week your child's curriculum level attainment for Term 1 in Reading/Pānui, Writing/Tuhituhi and Mathematics/Pangarau will be posted in their Feed. These will appear in a graph form with a dot indicating where your child is sitting in the curriculum. The timing of these posts is to coincide with our Whānau Conferences on Wednesday and Thursday.

Early in Term 2 curriculum goals and STARS values goals will be set, and appear in each student's Feed, based on their curriculum attainment and conversations with whānau from conferences.

Sport:

21 students travelled to the Super 11 Bay of Plenty and Poverty Bay Swimming Sports Championships on Friday. All swimmers competed extremely well in their selected events. Our girls Year 7, 4x 50 freestyle team picked up first with an outstanding come from behind win. Our boys Year 8 champion, Fabian (Totara), continued his further successes with four golds in the 100m freestyle, 100m backstroke, 100m breaststroke, 50m breaststroke, and 50m backstroke. He won the Year 8 boys overall championship. Congratulations Fabian!

Winter codes registrations have all gone out via Hero; these have now closed. We are extremely grateful to all of those people who have assisted with trials as this is a huge process for us. <u>Buses</u> - we continue to have a small number of students whose behaviour on the bus is not acceptable. Students who continue to breach our bus code of conduct and/or our STARS Essential Agreement, will be removed from their bus for a period of time and other transport arrangements will need to be made.

Vaping is sadly becoming more prevalent with youth throughout Aotearoa New Zealand and T.I.S. is not immune to this. We are aiming to educate all students about the life-long impacts of vaping and have a more intensive programme for those we identify as at-risk.
